

College Prep Resources for Military-Connected Students¹

There are many resources to help high school students prepare for universities, trade schools, and other post-secondary options. Although these resources have not been vetted, they may aid students as they prepare for, identify, or apply to post-secondary education.

Resource	Description
Schmoop.com	This resource provides test prep, learning guides, and study tools as well as college and career information.
Freerice.com	Free Rice provides quiz questions for English, math, humanities, chemistry, language learning, geography, sciences, and SAT test prep. For each answer a student answers correctly, Free Rice donates 10 grains of rice through the World Food Programme.
Khanacademy.org	Khan Academy provides online tutorials from experts in the field. Students take quizzes to start, so they are learning at their level.
INeedAPencil.ck12.org	This service provides free SAT prep and online textbooks.
myCollegeOptions.org	Based upon a profile students create, they can be matched with colleges and scholarships.
going2college.org	This resource provides information for students to explore careers, plan for college, find a college, and pay for college.
CollegeGoalSundayUSA.org	A volunteer program that helps students and families prepare for post-secondary education by providing free financial aid information.
SchoolQuest.org	An initiative of The Military Child Education Coalition provides this resource to aid in the transition of military-connected students. It also provides information about the transition to college.
FirstGenerationStudent.com	This resource provides information on planning for, finding, applying to, paying for, and succeeding in college for first-generation college students.
YoUniversityTV.com	This video-based website provides short videos for many colleges and universities as well as careers and college tips.
